
Learning at Home

At Meridan, we are well prepared for learning at home. Our suite of core learning apps, including our Canvas LMS, builds creative lesson content and strong collaborative practices.

Before learning at home	Teachers will make contact with students via email providing them an overview of the week.	Students should follow their school timetable and go to their Canvas course at the time indicated on their timetable. Timetables will be sent via email on 29/1/22.
Attendance	SMS text messages will be sent to parents for student absence to gather information about student wellbeing or check for IT issues.	Attendance will be taken in session 1 classes. Students are expected to follow their timetable and login to their Canvas classroom as this will be used as an initial attendance record.
Daily routines	Canvas By the start of each lesson the teacher will post an announcement containing key messages, links to lesson resources, and a link to the Teams meeting.	Students will be expected to engage with the learning materials and participate in Teams meetings before submitting work to their teacher on Canvas.
	Microsoft Teams Teachers will host live sessions on Teams for a range of direct instruction, group discussion, and Q&A support for their class.	Teams meetings can be accessed via the Canvas classroom, or may be sent as an email calendar invite.

Canvas is our Learning Management System (LMS) and is where learning activities, assessment, and grades can be found. Every subject a student is enrolled in has its own course in Canvas. Students use Canvas to engage with learning materials, communicate with their teacher and peers, and submit work for feedback and grading.




The Meridan SC Canvas login page
